## MORAY COUNCIL (ROTHIEMAY) REVOCATION OF TREE PRESERVATION ORDER 2023

MORAY COUNCIL, as Planning Authority, acting under Section 160 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 and

made a Tree Preservation Order known as Moray Council (Rothiemay) Revocation of Tree Preservation Order 2023

The effect of the Order will be to revoke The Moray Council (Rothiemay) Tree Preservation Order 1998. The grounds for making the Revocation Order are that on a site visit it was noted that a large area of the playing field covered by the Tree Preservation Order had been planted with new trees. As it could be interpreted that these trees are protected by the TPO it is proposed that the TPO no longer meets the terms for which it was originally served and should be revoked. A new TPO is proposed for the trees on the boundary of the King George Playing Field at Rothiemay. The Order shall continue in force unless Moray Council fails to confirm the Order by 16th September 2023.
